Description of Program

The UCSF International Dentist Program (IDP) is a two-year (8-quarter) program administered by the UCSF School of Dentistry. The program may extend beyond two years depending on the student's ability to meet all graduation requirements.

The program admits 28 foreign-trained dentists yearly. The program begins in June of each year and culminates in a Doctor of Dental Science (DDS) degree. These students will matriculate into the existing third year didactic curriculum.

Requirements to Apply to Program

English Language Proficiency

- ✘ Must be proficient in the English language
- ✘ All applicants must take the TOEFL to be considered for admission
- ✘ Submit official TOEFL Score Report to program (not to ADEA CAAPID) – Code #6143
- ✘ Applicants whose native language is not English are required to take the TOEFL
- ✘ Minimum TOEFL Scores are as follows, and must have been taken within 2 years of the application deadline:
 - * 95 or higher on the internet based test (iBT), or
 - * 240 or higher on the computer test, or
 - * 587 or higher on the paper test

National Board Dental Examination Requirements

- ✘ Applicants must pass Part I of NBDE
- ✘ Submit official NBDE Part 1 Report to program (not to ADEA CAAPID)
- ✘ Part II of the NBDE is not required for admission.

Advanced Dental Admission Test (ADAT)

- ✘ Completion of the ADAT will not be considered during application review for admission to the program.

Letters of Evaluation

- ✘ Requires (3) letters of recommendation (dean, faculty & candidate choice)
- ✘ Letters must come stamped and sealed from individuals providing the recommendation.

Transcripts and Evaluations

- ✘ Applicants must submit original dental school, non-dental school and all postgraduate program transcripts directly to program.
- ✘ Transcripts **must come stamped and sealed from all conferring institutions**. Notarized copies are not acceptable. Please refer to our website for translation of documents.
- ✘ Submit original official ECE course-by-course evaluation. Dental School transcript must have a GPA of 2.00 (comprehensive) or higher in order to be considered for admission. To ensure uniformity of evaluation, the ECE is the only credential evaluation report accepted.

Application Fees

- ✘ A non-refundable application fee of \$200.00 (USD) in the form of a money order or cashier's check, payable to "UC Regents", must be submitted.

Additional Requirements

1. Before final admission, provisionally admitted applicants who need a visa must complete a Confidential Financial Statement. The certification is necessary for UCSF to provide a Certificate of Eligibility (I-20A/B) which allows the applicant to apply for a student visa. The I-20 A/B is only given to applicants granted final acceptance to the IDP.
