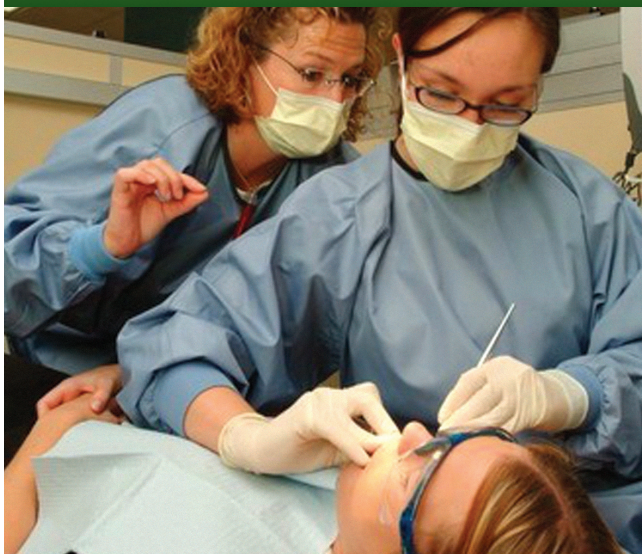


CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

Now in its second year, the ADEA/AAL Institute for Allied Health Educators (IAHE) is designed to help allied health educators upgrade their teaching skills and learn new ways to increase job satisfaction and professional growth.

Program I course content includes: case-based learning; classroom and clinical teaching best practices; course planning and instructional design; evaluation of student performance; learning styles; and working productively with difficult students.

Program II addresses: calibration of clinical faculty; best practices in assessment; designing effective presentations; counseling students who are struggling; evaluating and motivating faculty; quality of faculty work life; and teaching style and philosophy. Participants may register for either program or both.

The IAHE is facilitated by nationally recognized experts in education, curriculum, leadership, and higher education. Faculty members in dental hygiene or dental assisting—whether beginners or experienced faculty seeking mid-career development—are encouraged to apply.
